OCEAN SCHOOLS: BECOMING AS BIG AS THE OCEAN EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES 2023 | 2024

With the beginning of the academic year, the permanent program "Ocean Schools" starts back up in September, featuring free training sessions for teachers until December. The first session is an introduction to this year's activities. Throughout the year, the program unfolds through thematic deep dives, theoretical reflections, and practical suggestions for the most pressing issues of our time: climate and the environment, humanity, and the blue planet.

After the initial phase for teachers, the program directly involves students with training sessions and digital workshops, along with direct connections with schools via interactive whiteboards. The aim is to encourage collective reflection, critical thinking, and to inspire environmentally conscious actions.

Students aged 3 to 19 will explore an interdisciplinary path this year, called "Ocean The Sign," tailored to different grade levels. It is based on social design and communication in all its forms. They will be guided in creating digital and analog audiovisual materials in the classroom.

The new sessions will delve into a vision that borrows from both science and art, the practice of observation, using sign language as a medium for understanding, observing, collecting, documenting, and creating a collective, visual, and performative narrative about the sea and its infinite relationships. These sessions will be in collaboration with Paola Vitale, a teacher, writer, and science communicator, artist Giulia Bruno, and researchers Angela Pomaro from the Institute of Marine Sciences CNR-ISMAR and Olga Capirci from the Institute of Cognitive Sciences and Technologies CNR-LaCAM.

OBJECTIVES

- Create a vibrant and active community of teachers and students around environmental issues through a polyphonic, participatory, and inclusive dialogue.
- Foster ecological awareness to improve the environment through a multidisciplinary approach and inspiring lifelong learning.
- Co-design together, by addressing the learning needs and requirements through continuous feedback from students, teachers, and Ocean Space educational staff.
- Promote inclusive pathways through the use of Sign Language and facilitated texts in two disciplinary areas: scientific-technological and linguistic-anthropological-artistic.

- January March 2024: Training sessions and workshops for students to support the creation of audiovisual materials, both analog and digital, in the classroom.
